**Occupational Pension Schemes (Public Service Pension  
Schemes) Regulations 2009**

The Secretary of State for Work and Pensions and the Treasury jointly, make the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred on them by sections 1(1) and 182(2) of the Pension Schemes Act 1993(a), being of the opinion that the occupational pension scheme[s] referred to in regulation 2 of these Regulations ought to be treated as a public service pension scheme for the purposes of the Pension Schemes Act 1993.

In accordance with section 185(1) and (5) of the Pension Schemes Act 1993 the Secretary of State for Work and Pensions and the Treasury jointly, have consulted such persons as they consider appropriate before making these Regulations.

**Citation and commencement**

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Occupational Pension Schemes (Public Service Pension Schemes) Regulations 2009 and shall come into force on [    ].

**Scheme[s] to be treated as a public service pension scheme**

2. The Scottish Parliamentary Pension Scheme [and the First Minister and Presiding Officer Pension Scheme] shall be treated for the purposes of the Pension Schemes Act 1993 as [a] public service pension scheme[s].

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations provide that the Scottish Parliamentary Pension Scheme [and the First Minister and Presiding Officer Pension Scheme] shall be treated for the purposes of the Pension Schemes Act 1993 as [a] public service pension scheme[s].

An impact assessment has not been published for this instrument as it has only a negligible impact on the private, public and voluntary sectors.
